1st Reading Jonah 3:1-5, 10

The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time, saying, ²'Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you.' ³So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. ⁴Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, 'Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!' ⁵And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth.

Gospel Reading Mark 1:14-20

Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news. Jesus Calls the First Disciples

As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake—for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fish for people.' And immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him.

THE NANCY WOODROFFE BAKER TRUST

This Trust was formed in 1987 by Peter Baker (a long-standing member of our congregation) with funds donated in memory of his wife Nancy. At a recent meeting of the trustees it was resolved to make a distribution as follows under the three categories in the Trust's deed of governance.

- 1) £1,000 to Toybox for relief work with children in El Salvador, £1,000 to Mercy Ships to provide urgent medical care to those in need, and £1,000 to Christian Aid specifically for their relief work in Indonesia (the relief of the poor or sick inhabitants of underdeveloped countries)
- 2) £1,500 to Barnabas Aid to help persecuted Christians and £1,500 to Open Doors to support Christians in Syria (the propagation of the Christian gospel amongst such inhabitants) 3) £3,000 to St Michael's (pastoral care and evangelical work of St Michael's Church Boldmere)
